Direct Services:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM Doors open exactly at 9:00 AM. Clients will be expected to fill out a short daily intake, and service order will be based on the requested service.

DMV Voucher for CA-ID:

Please bring documentation with your name on it showing you are currently receiving government benefits (i.e. EBT card, MediCal card, Notice of Action/DHA printout, Social Security award letter) to be eligible for a reduced fee voucher.

Bus Pass:

One bus pass is given every seven days for verifiable medical, dental, or court appointments. Verifiable meaning a written, email, text or voicemail confirmation of the appointment.

Hygiene Kits:

Essential toiletry items are available upon request during normal hours of operation.

<u>Clothing Donation Center:</u>

Must have a Valid ID to enter. Up to 10 items per visit, one visit per calendar month. Open Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM.

Special Advocates (Not available during COVID):

- Veterans' Advocate on site Thursdays from 9:00 AM 11 AM.
- Notary available Thursdays by APPOINTMENT ONLY.

Diversion Program: NOTE: THE DIVERSION PROGRAM WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE UNTIL JULY OF 2022.

This program provides assistance with utilities, first month's rent, or eviction avoidance to low income families.

Homeless Verification and Birth Certificate Affidavits for Homeless Individuals:

Francis House Center does not currently verify homelessness as a 3rd Party. Birth certificate fee waiver affidavits are available to any homeless individual who can provide 3rd Party verification or proof of currently living in a homeless shelter.

"New Eyes" Eye Glass Voucher Program:

Low income and homeless individuals are eligible to receive one free pair of eyeglasses per year.

You must be able to provide:

- A recent eyeglass prescription from the last 12 months
- Your pupillary distance measurement
- Proof of income

Open Resource Lab:

Tuesdays and Thursday, 9am-12pm. The computer lab is open to any adults who enroll and offers access to the internet, printing for necessary documents, and staff support with basic questions.

211 Care Coordination:

Tuesday/Thursdays 9am-12pm Client-centered case management for connecting with resources. By appointment or referral only.

Free Covid-19 Testing through SwiftCheck:

Tuesdays 9am-12pm. Rapid tests and PCR tests are provided at no cost by walk-up. May require CA ID.

Lifeline Program phones through SafeLink Wireless:

Every other Thursday, available in the FHC parking lot. May require CA-ID and not having received a Lifeline phone within 12 months.

CalWORKS:

The CalWORKs Homeless Assistance (HA) Program was established to help families in the CalWORKs program with emergency shelter when a family is experiencing homelessness. CalWORKs HA program serves eligible CalWORKs recipients or apparently eligible CalWORKs applicants, who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. CalWORKs Temporary HA can provide payments for temporary shelter for up to 16 days. Families experiencing homelessness should go into a DHA office (except 1725 28th Street) to get assessed for Homeless Assistance.
